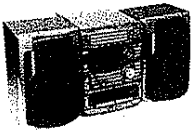

## Shop till you drop in New York

*Find your way through New York's department stores, shops and markets.*

### Fifth Avenue

If you aren't worried about your credit card bill, Fifth Avenue is the place for you. In the world's most famous shopping district you'll find so many shops—from designer label boutiques to antique shops—that you won't know where to begin. If you like department stores, visit *Saks Fifth Avenue* at 49th Street, very close to St Patrick's Cathedral. Those who prefer shopping centres will enjoy *575 The Center of Fifth* (at 47th Street) and *Trump Tower* (at 56th Street), with its expensive high fashion boutiques.

### Manhattan Mall

*Manhattan Mall* (on Sixth Avenue and 33rd Street) is only one block away from the Empire State Building. It has 80 shops on nine floors—including *Sterns Department Store*—and New York's largest Food Court. You can also watch music and drama performances from different parts of the world every day.

### Green Flea Indoor and Outdoor Markets

The ideal place to spend a Sunday morning. You'll find an unbelievable selection of clothes, jewellery, antiques, CDs, new and second-hand books, as well as flowers, fresh fruit and vegetables.

### Orchard Street

Thousands of shoppers from all over the world visit the historic Orchard Street Bargain District in Lower Manhattan. Look for the best bargains in clothes, shoes, leather goods, jewellery, furniture and lots more.

### South Street Seaport

The 19th and early 20th century buildings in the area have been changed into galleries, boutiques and shops. In the *Fulton Market Building* you'll find the famous *Fulton Fish Market*, where selling begins at 5 a.m.! There are also over 100 cafés and restaurants, so your only problem will be deciding where to have lunch.
